**Notes:**

**Parents:** The materials posted on our Website(s), as well as the concussion newsletter distribution, counts as the education requirement for Parents. The acknowledgement they sign annually meets that requirement.

**Coaches:** The CEP classes and modules meet any legislation requirements. The P.D. Protocol annual acknowledgement meets the annual requirement.

**Athletes:** Athletes are able to meet an annual education requirement in any number of ways: Team meeting, handout, taking the CDC course online. Individual signatures, a team sign-in sheet, or a CDC certificate, are all acceptable.
